The United States Congress, or simply Congress for short, is the first branch of the United States federal government. Congress has the primary responsibility for the creation of a national statutory law provided, subject to the restrictions set out in the Constitution. For more explanation: This information describes the official procedure by which the bill becomes law. But virtually all research and negotiation is in the process of law-making occurs from recordings at meetings between employees who work for senators and representatives, members of the public, lobbyists for nonprofits and businesses, and federal agencies. What happens after Congress passes the law? The adoption of the law is only the very first step in the creation of national policy. From a legal point of view, once a bill becomes law, it is assigned a number and then published in the Statutes of the United States as a whole. General and permanent laws are then incorporated into the United States Code. Many laws direct federal agencies to certain actions, such as the creation or termination of a government program. Once the law is passed, the authorities must determine how the law will be implemented. They can create new rules that are also laws! For more on regulations, see What are the checks and balances on laws crated by Congress? There are many checks and balances of the limited power of Congress to create laws. The executive branch - that is, the president and federal government agencies - can choose how to enforce the law within the limits set by Congress. Federal courts may rule that Congress acted outside the limits of the Constitution when passing the law (i.e. it is unconstitutional).
