Whatever the reason, fans often have a hard time watching when they're on screen. Here are the 10 worst characters on The Walking Dead. 10. Father Gabriel's Father Gabriel in The Walking Dead AMC You could give Father Gabriel points for trying these days. But then, when you remember his early decisions, it's hard to forgive and forget. The priest was certainly not the pinnacle of piety, after all. Despite the fact that he is a man of cloth, many of his choices and actions were completely selfish. Since we never got a chance to see what drove his decision to confess his sins and try to help Rick and his friends, it's hard to know where he's going from these days. Father Gabriel could be an interesting and valuable character if we knew better what was driving him. 9. Lori Grimes Laurie Grimes AMC Laurie Grimes was, in many ways, the most universally hated character in the early years of The Walking Dead. In a way, the hate was unjustified - after all, she didn't know Rick was alive when she started sleeping with Shane. And she sacrificed her life only to give her unborn child a chance at life. However, most of Laurie's decisions were completely incomprehensible. She had an innate inability to lose her son, Carl, and did not seem to be trying particularly hard to cope with the difficult situation that arose between her, her husband and his best friend. Laurie was a rare character who seemed to make things worse every time she got involved, which got bogged down in a series of narratives. Ultimately, her penchant for making terrible decisions and then defensively pounced on those who called her made her extremely unsympathetic. 8. Thomas Thomas AMC The Walking Dead has many characters and it would be almost impossible for the creators of the series to fully develop them all. However, when it came to the inmates that Rick and Co. encountered at the start of Season 3, the writers left much to be desired. Thomas, the leader of the de facto prison group, was perhaps the most disappointing of all. This is largely due to the fact that his confrontation with Rick is more or less tantamount to a youthful battle of the will. He was and unnecessarily hated towards people who more or less offered them a chance at life. And he ended up killing himself and his friend, just because he didn't want to negotiate. 7. Gareth Gareth AMC The Walking Dead fans have learned that there are many ways to survive the zombie apocalypse, and very few of them are related to keeping both your sanity and your humanity completely intact. Of course, when it came to Gareth and his team at Terminus, it seemed like they weren't even trying on that front. Gareth seemed like he might be a compelling, interesting character at first. Unfortunately, he quickly took a turn in the over-the-top villain category. His cartoonish glee at eating Bob's limb was strange, to say the least. However, his obsessive need to track down Rick and his friends was even more bizarre. Since it was difficult to understand why he behaved so erratically, it was difficult to really invest in his character. It was pretty cool watching Rick take it down, though. 6. Andrea Andrea AMC Fans of The Walking Dead comics were probably very excited when Laurie Holden was cast as Andrea. That's because in its original incarnation, The Lawyer-turned-survivor is one of the coolest characters the series has ever seen. Unfortunately, this was not the case at all for Andrea's AMC version. In short, she proved to be the opposite of her comic book colleague: waffle-y, whiny, and unable to take a stand when it really matters. She had to be chained up with Shane and the governor, both of whom actively tried to kill their friends and allies. At times it seemed that she was deliberately working against her own interests. Andrea's decisions lingered sympathy for her. But in the end, what really made her one of the worst characters in The Walking Dead was how badly she lived up to her potential. 5. Spencer Monroe's The Walking Dead AMC Some fans may have felt bad for people in Alexandria, at least for a while. When we first met them, they lived an idyllic existence seemingly immune to the horrors of the apocalypse. Then they had to deal with the harsh reality that he was no longer safe. Some characters, such as Aaron, have coped with this reality better than others. Spencer Monroe probably handled it worse though. Yes, he mourned the loss of his entire family. But his approach to survival as a zombie around the safe zone and Negan's anger mostly amounted to just throwing Rick under the bus. His arrogance was never justified, his attempts to help protect Alexandria almost always backfired. In short, Spencer split his time on The Walking Dead between a serious problem and being a complete jerk. 4. Gregory Gregory AMC If any standard theme about leadership originated in The Walking Dead seven seasons, it is this: leadership in the apocalypse is not all its cracked up to be. However, of them have mastered it better than others. And whoever has done, perhaps, the worst work for him so far is There are many reasons not to love the Hilltop leader. His approach to management is fairweather at best. He seems content to let Negan walk all over him and his people. He seems to have very little respect for women, or those who disagree with him. The question arises as to why he is still a leader at all. If fans loved hating a villain like the governor, or even Negan, they probably hate to spend so much time with Gregory on TV screens. 3. Pete Anderson Pete, Reg and Deanna Monroe AMC In some ways, Pete Anderson took a page straight from the Ed Pelletier playbook. Except, in his case, he was able to beat his wife and children under his own roof in Alexandria, rather than in a tent on the side of the road. There was something particularly insidious about Pete's methods of managing his family. On the one hand, Ed never pretended to be a good guy - Pete did. But Pete wasn't as smooth as he thought he was. And when his attempts to cover up his domestic violence habits exploded in his face, he turned his rage on others. It was sad that poor Reg had to die, and in such a cruel way, only because Pete did not want his power taken away. But it was actually a relief when Deanna finally gave Rick the go-ahead to just get rid of the guy. 2. Ed Pelletier Ed in The Walking Dead AMC Here's a complete list of things Ed Pelletier is going for him: a charming daughter, Sophia; loving wife, Carol; and a group of people wanting to take care of his family. The fact that he insulted Carol and Sophia, and had a sullen jerk for Rick, Shane and the rest of the band, just made it much more horrific. Indeed, as a man and a Walking Dead character, he really doesn't have a redemptive quality. It's a credit to the series that they never tried to garner any sympathy for a character as despicable as Ed. Even though it only lasted a few episodes, it was a relief to see him go - and perfectly therapeutic watching Carol desecrate his walker-chomped remains. 1. Negan The Walking Dead in Negan AMC There's no denying that Negan is one of the most consistent characters The Walking Dead has ever seen. The series has changed deeply since it came on board in the final moments of season six. His unique brand of pot-mouthed, abusive leadership has changed the way that Rick and his allies live their lives. But just because he's important doesn't mean he deserves the awe the series has given him. Negan is not as gorgeous as he thinks. Some fans might argue that he doesn't like it as much as the creators of the series think he is, either. So far we have seen a lot of evidence of his bad behavior, but little motivation as to why. So while it's really unforgettable, it's not a very well developed character in any sense. This makes it unique to most other big TWD villains, and not in a good way. For Negan to truly join the ranks of great characters, will need to do more than swing Lucille around and wisecrack.
